## 2024 USA Ultimate Youth Club Competition Structure Survey

#### Introduction

Earlier in 2024 we surveyed Local Disc Organizations regarding the youth club (non-school based) competition structure. Based on that survey and other data points, we have identified three structures that could be compelling to the community. In this survey we are looking for the opinions of youth players, their parents, their coaches and others involved in youth ultimate. ### Our goal:

We want to build a youth club competition structure that provides access to national competition and increases playing opportunities at both the regional and local level. Our current system, a single national event called the Youth Club Championships (YCC), has surpassed its capacity limits in several divisions.

This survey has three parts. The first two parts each contain 1-2 required questions and should take a total of 4-7 minutes to complete, while Part III is completely optional and will take another 10-15 minutes to complete.

Part I helps us understand your connection to youth ultimate.

Part II asks you to weigh the value of the  $\bf 3$  different competition structures.

Part III asks your preferences on various aspects of youth competition, which can largely be applied to any of the 3 competitive structures. (These will be used to help us craft detailed implementation guidelines.)

Part II

Current Structure: Organizational Priority Application for standalone YCC YCC is an annual event (in early August) with no direct connections to any other events for youth club teams. Teams must submit applications for YCC, and the <u>acceptance process follows a set of priorities that measure sponsoring organizations' state and local youth ultimate programming</u> (growth, size, gender diversity, etc.). Once a YCC age-gender division is full (16-24 teams accepted), all remaining applications are waitlisted and teams can only attend if a spot opens up (an accepted team drops).

Following are three new structures that could be implemented in the future. Each includes an example of a draft model to illustrate how each might look. Please do not vote based on the example, but instead focus on the general structure that you prefer.

New Structure: Regional Competition Qualification for YCC (make regionals, not applications, the way teams get to YCC)

- · YCC remains in August.
- · Teams qualify for YCC only by results at Regionals.
  - 2/3 of bids are earned by winning a regional.
- Regions will have the ability to earn extra bids by accomplishing priorities that incentivize state & local youth ultimate.
  - 1/3 of bids are earned by finishing in 2nd place in a regional that has earned an extra bid.

This approach has all teams earning a bid to attend YCC based on their competition results at regional qualifying events (i.e., single qualification system). About two-thirds of the bids will be earned by a team winning a regional qualifying event. The remaining one-third of bids will be distributed to regions that earn extra bids to YCC (i.e., won by teams placing 2nd or lower in the regional competition), based on priorities that incentivize state & local youth ultimate activity (growth, size, gender diversity, outreach, etc.).

Example model of regional qualification

New Structure: Hybrid Qualification Pathways to YCC (offer both regionals & applications for teams to get to YCC)

- · YCC remains in August.
- · Two ways for teams to be invited to YCC:
  - 2/3 of the bids are earned by winning a regional.
  - 1/3 of the bids are awarded to organizations via an application process based on a priority system.

This approach would create a dual qualification system for teams to be invited to YCC. Teams could pursue either or both pathways. About two-thirds of the bids will be earned by a team winning a regional qualifying event. The remaining one-third will be awarded via a team application acceptance process, based on a set of priorities that measure sponsoring organizations' state and local youth ultimate programming (growth, size, gender diversity, outreach, etc.).

Example model of hybrid pathways

New Structure: Two National Events (leave YCC as is, add new separate Juniors Club series)

- YCC doesn't change. It remains in August as an invitational for teams representing Local Disc Organizations.
- A new Junior Club series will be added in the mid to late fall, culminating with a National Championship.
  - Teams earn bids to Junior Nationals by winning regionals.
- The two events are not connected. Teams and players could compete in one or both events.

This approach maintains the YCC qualification system's current structure, with an application and acceptance process based on priorities that measure sponsoring organizations' state and local youth ultimate programming (growth, size, gender diversity, etc.). This structure adds a new junior club series where youth club teams qualify through regional events. YCCs and the Junior club are two separate events. This means that players could play in either season or both seasons. And, if they are playing both seasons they could do so on different teams.

9. The **number of youth club regions** across the U.S. that qualify one or more teams to national events is important for such considerations as distance and competition level.

With **more regions**, the smaller and **more geographically accessible** each regional event is with **less driving distance** on average.

With **fewer regions**, the larger and **more competitive** each regional event will typically be, with **more bids to nationals** per region available.
